## Impact of using PPSG 2015-16

All children access specialist PE teaching on a regular basis

All children in Reception to Y6 access outdoor learning activities

All children in Year 4, 5 and 6 have the opportunity to attend a residential visit (very few children do not take up this opportunity).

Gold award from SSP for attending all local competitions

Swindon cross country champions, Central league football champions, , Orienteering champions,), boccia winners

SRP represented Swindon for Boccia at South West Championships

Every child in year 6 represented the school at least twice

Greater range of sports clubs now available as requested by the school council: As well as the traditional sports we have offered cheerleading, fencing, dance, forest schools and spy club.

72% of KS2 and 94% KS1 have accessed an after school club over the year 2015-16
