World Book Day

Recently we had a fantastic World Book Day based upon Goldilocks and the three bears. The day started with a highly professional, well-acted play performed by some of our staff ! From this, the day was then spent fully engaged with the children moving between classes to try a range of tasks. Foundation stage, Years 1 and 2 included tasting porridge, decorating bears, using Purple Mash to develop graphs and making story map props for retelling the story. Year 3 and 4 went on a bear hunt, made wanted posters, designed houses to keep humans out and investigated the time it takes for porridge to cool. Two of our Year 6 pupils have written about their day

“On World book day we had lots of fun, Goldilocks-based activities to do. This included acting scenes of the Goldilocks story including French phrases; making patches for a quilt in pairs; being forensic scientists—finding out if it was actually Goldilocks who broke into the bear’s house; and debating ‘whether or not Goldilocks was guilty of any crimes.’ “

“My favourite activity was when we had a debate and went in front of assembly to act in the court scene.”

“My favourite part of World Book Day was when the teachers acted out Goldilocks in court as the Jury came to the conclusion that she was guilty of several crimes!”



As you can see it was a packed day which then led to some impressive writing. Well done all—we are already looking forward to next year.

Thank you Choir - you were amazing.

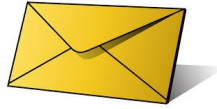
