#### **Maths**

The mental maths focus for this term is doubling and halving. This includes doubling and halving odd and even numbers including decimals. As written methods for the four operations become more efficient, children will also be using reasoning and problem solving skills to tackle more complex challenges. Additionally, children will be revisiting how to find the area and perimeter of rectangles and more complex compound shapes made up of multiple rectangles.

#### <u>Science</u>

During our topic about living things, the children will be learning about plants as well as different groups of animals and their lifecycles. Excitingly, Year 5 will have the opportunity to witness the hatching of chicks from eggs.

#### P.S.H.E.
