


Lost Property

Another year of sports at RLK has come to an end. This year every child in Year 6 has once again represented us on at least three occasions. We have participated in football, netball, rugby, hockey, cricket, rounders, cross-country, athletics, dodgeball and golf against other schools in competitions and festivals. The most important aim at RLK is sport for all; every child deserves a chance to participate and therefore they will have played for this school by the time they leave Year 6 regardless of their ability or experience. However, we have still remained competitive and were Swindon Cricket Winners and Central League Football Champions, the former the seventh time in nine seasons we have topped the league.
