

English

Our English work this term includes both fiction and non-fiction writing. The non-fiction work will focus on identifying and using the features of non-fiction texts. The fiction work will be based on the story of Oliver's Vegetables, focussing on comparative language and prefixes and suffixes. The poetry work will be based upon creating simple poems about Spring.

Science

Throughout the term we shall be looking at different types of plants and trees in the environment and talking about their similarities and differences. These features will then be used to help identify some common garden and wild plants. The children will learn the names of the key parts of plants. During the term the children will have a go at planting different seeds and observing and recording their growth.

Maths

This term we will continue to develop our understanding of numbers to 100, reading, comparing, ordering and writing them in numbers and words. The children will use their knowledge of multiplication and division to solve simple word problems. Through practical activities the children will be describing, comparing and measuring weight. The children will also develop their understanding of common 2d and 3d shapes by naming and describing them.

Computing

This term, we will be animating! The children will start by looking at what e-books are and identifying the different components. They will then create their own animated story by using the 2-Create a Story program to combine pictures, text and sound.

P.S.H.E.

Our P.S.H.E. work this term will be based around the theme of 'Relationships'. The children will be thinking about what makes the relationships we have with others special.

Art

The art for this term will focus on the idea of sculpture. The children will be looking at some of the work of Andy Goldsworthy and using some natural materials to make simple sculptures of their own.

Geography

Our focus this term in geography will be on the local area. The children will look at features they find in the school grounds and local area, using first and experience and photos. They will describe the features they see and sort them according to whether they are human or physical features.

P.E.

In P.E. this term the children will learn and develop basic movement skills for use in team games. They will gain an awareness of space and how to accurately perform movements. They will then start to play games with tactics.

R.E.

Our RE topic this term will focus upon the celebration of Shabbat, looking at how and why Jewish people celebrate their special days.

Music

This term will see us focus on the musical theme of 'Your Imagination' with the children listening to, learning and performing songs linked to children's films.
