

English

Our literacy work this term includes both fiction and non-fiction writing. We will be focusing on the story of 'The Elephant and the Bad Baby', sequencing the events and changing parts of it to make our own story. To link with our DT work, we will then be writing instructions for making our healthy picnic food. Towards the end of the term, we will be finding out about Neil Armstrong and the moon landing so we will use the knowledge we have gained about this to complete some non-fiction writing.

Science

Throughout this term, we shall be looking at the seasonal changes that happen during the summer. The children will also learn about the features of different animals and how we can sort and group animals according to their features.

Maths

This term we will continue to develop our understanding of numbers to and beyond 100, comparing, ordering and writing them. The children will represent numbers using pictures and number lines and compare them using vocabulary such as more than, less than and fewer. During the term the children will use the operations of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division to solve simple word problems. The children will use the relevant vocabulary to name and talk about 3d shapes and describe position, direction and movements such as whole, half and quarter turns.

Design Technology

The children will identify and taste a range of healthy foods that could be used to create simple picnic foods. They will then evaluate their finished product in terms of look and taste.

R.E.

Our R.E. work this term continues with the study of Judaism, looking at how the festivals of Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur are important to Jewish children.

P.S.H.E.

Our P.S.H.E. work this term will be based around the theme of 'Changing Me'. Through the study of animal life cycles the children will be learning how baby animals change as they grow into adults.

History

Music

This term will see us focus on listening to and appraising instrumental music. The children will also revise some of their ideas about pitch, pulse and beat and then create a class performance of a previously learned song.

Computing

This term the children will be learning how to create moving scenes on the computer using simple coding (programming). Later in the term, our focus will be on creating simple spreadsheets.
