

<p><u>SATs revision guides</u></p> <p>Children to complete <u>at least 1 mini test each day from at least one of the three books.</u> Please get your children to show their workings out and carefully answer each question. It is important they use this time to embed the skills already learnt in school.</p>	<p><u>Reading:</u></p> <p>We have an expectation that children will read <u>five</u> times a week, usually with an adult. Adults need to initial or sign the reading record each time this happens. We are sending extra books home to cover the time your children are at home. Please ask questions about what they have read.</p>	<p><u>Other activities</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Research a plant of your choice and create a poster about it. Think about where it grows, how it grows and how to look after it. - Draw 2 detailed pictures, one of Antarctica and the other of a Safari, then label with expanded noun phrases. Think about what animals and plants would live there and how they have adapted to their environment.
