Writing:

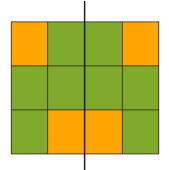
Have a go at the activities based on 'The King of The Fishes' which has been uploaded. You only need to go up to page 13. This is the same writing work as last week.
