

Maths

In school we will be following the White Rose videos and worksheets which we have set for home learning so far. These are available for you to download from the school website.

This week we are looking at partitioning and comparing numbers.

English

We have an expectation that children will read **five** times a week, with an adult. Adults need to initial or sign the reading record each time this happens. The children are also encouraged to read their own books/comics etc during this time.

In school, we will be basing our work around the story of 'Hooray for Birds' and information texts about birds.

- Make a list of the different sounds made by the birds in the story. Don't forget to use! Make another list of verbs such as swim, peck, swoop.
- What birds can you see and hear in your garden? Draw one of them and find out some facts about this type of bird.

Birds

This term

Our topic is all about animals, what they eat and how they are classified. We will be giving you ideas on how to do this at home. This week we will be looking at birds.

- Science—What birds can you see and hear in your garden? Draw one of them and label the different features.
- RE—Find a picture of Buddha to colour in. Write some words around the picture to explain the importance of Buddha.
