

Maths

In school we will be following the White Rose videos and worksheets which we have set for home learning so far. These are available for you to download from the school website.

This week we are looking at recognising coins and using them to count in 2's, 5's and 10's.

English

We have an expectation that children will read **five** times a week, with an adult. Adults need to initial or sign the reading record each time this happens. The children are also encouraged to read their own books/comics etc during this time.

In school, we will be basing our work around the story of 'The Selfish Crocodile' and the poem 'The Crocodile' by Lewis Carroll.

- Watch the story once more. Instead of listening to the story, retell what is happening on each page in your own words.
- Write a description of the crocodile from the story. Don't forget to include how he looks and behaves.

Reptiles

This term

Our topic is all about animals, what they eat and how they are classified. We will be giving you ideas on how to do this at home. This week we will be looking at reptiles.

Purple Mash (set as 2do)

- Sort the mammals and the reptiles

Other activities

- Art— find some things around your house that might make a good reptile skin texture. Maybe raid the recycling! Can you use paint to print a picture of a reptile?
- Science— Find out about different reptiles. How are they different from the other animals we have looked at? How many different sorts can you name?
- PSHE—what does it mean to be selfish? Can you think of a time you have been selfish? The opposite of selfish is selfless, doing something for other people even if it is hard for you. Can you think of something selfless you could do for someone in (or all of!) your family?
- RE—research Wesak lanterns (used to celebrate Buddha's birthday). Can you make one of your own and decorate it?
