Objectives of spending PPSG

To continue to improve the provision of PE, Sport and the Adventurous Curriculum at RLK delivered by the specialist PE teacher

To continue the range of quality extra-curricular PE opportunities so that participation is maintained and Platinum Award criteria continued

Specialist teacher to assist other teachers with their planning and delivery of PE in lessons

SSP Bronze Package to enter and access festivals and competitions and fund the entering of boys and girls football in Swindon Schools Football Package

Promote PE activities accessed by the physically impaired children in the Snug and enter competitions

Purchase appropriate equipment to support lessons and after-school clubs

Increase the amount of Pupil Premium children attending clubs

Invite every Year 6 child to attend at least one free club and for every Year 6 child to represent the school at a sporting event on several occasions

Impact of using PPSG 2019-20

All children access specialist PE teaching on a regular basis

All children in Reception to Y6 access outdoor learning activities

All children in Year 4 and 6 have the opportunity to attend a residential visit (very few children do not take up this opportunity). All children in year 5 have the opportunity to "camp out" at school and go sailing (Only half of year 4 were able to access their residential last year due to Covid-19).

Platinum Award from SSP for attending all local competitions and including all children in PE and sport (only a very small number of schools have this award)

High percentage of PP children included in clubs and representing school at sport

Won Swindon girls cross country, boys second in Swindon cross country. Runners up in the Swindon schools football league. Many other tournaments cancelled due to Covid-19)

SRP represented Swindon for Boccia at South West Championships

Every child in year 6 represented the school at least three times; most greatly exceed this number (despite Covid!)

Greater range of sports clubs now available as requested by the school council: As well as the traditional sports we have offered cheerleading, dance, forest schools, archery and fencing.

Several TA staff gaining the experience of assisting at and running sports clubs alongside specialist teacher.

We were unable to ascertain the percentage of children Year 6 achieving swimming milestones during the previous year due to Covid-19. However, all Year 3 children accessed a series of 15 swimming lessons. By the end of Year 3:
48% swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres
30% use a range of strokes effectively and perform a safe self-rescue in different water based situations
The school did not use the Sports grant to deliver additional swimming lessons beyond Year 3.
