Phonic sounds

- Children are taught the **sound** the letter makes rather than the letter **name**.
- **Speed Sounds One** are taught first which cover 31 sounds; **a - z** plus **ch,sh,th, ng** and **nk**.
- As soon as these sounds have been taught the children begin to use them in their reading and writing.

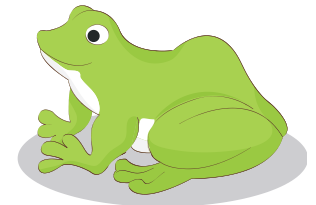
Fred talk!!

- Using phonic sounds to read words
- For example;

c a t = cat

m u m = mum

“If in doubt Fred it out!!”



Keywords - red words!!

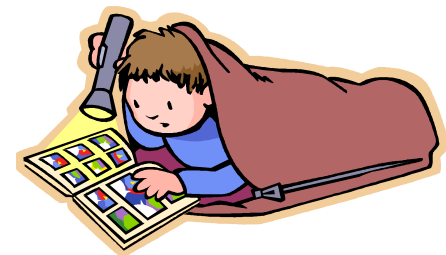
- These are the words which you just have to learn by sight. They cannot be sounded out (eg. the, he, she)

"You can't Fred a red!"

- The more children read the more familiar they will become with these words.

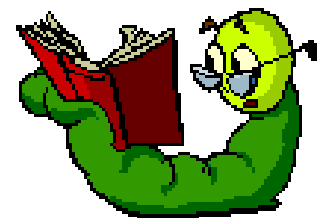
Moving on.....

- When confident with Speed Sounds 1 children move on to learn Speed Sounds 2 and 3.
- Worksheets with words using these sounds will be sent home as and when your child is learning them.
- A further workshop will be offered to explain these sounds at a later date.
- Your child should be able to teach them to you!!



Developing a love of reading

- Try to make reading fun not a chore!
- Share the reading of a book.
- Read to your child and ask them to find keywords.
- Talk about the story, think about what else could have happened.
- Comprehension is as important as reading the words correctly!
- When your child gets a reading book try reading 5 times a week at home. There is a list of reading activities you can do with your child at the front of their reading record. You do not have to read the same book 5 times!
