### COVID UPDATE

You will be aware that we have recently moved to step 3 of the governments roadmap of easing lockdown restrictions. Whilst for secondary schools students are no longer required to wear face masks in class, nothing has really changed for us as a primary school. We will still continue with our one-way system, staff will wear masks in communal areas and the children will continue to be encouraged to wash their hands.

If your child is absent from school, can we please remind you to state the reason for your child's absence when leaving a message. This is particularly important as we need to know if your child has any potential covid symptoms which may impact their whole bubble. Unfortunately a generic 'not very well' does not give us enough information and we will need to contact you to ascertain their symptoms.

One piece of good news is that after school clubs can now be held indoors, therefore on days when we only have one club this can take place in the hall if the weather is bad.
