Maths

We will also use our understanding of common factors and multiples to simplify and convert fractions. Then, we will focus on 2D and 3D shapes and their properties. To end the term, we will be consolidating our understanding of angles as well as learning about the properties of circles.

Geography

This term the children will be learning about Mountains. We will be using our map skills to identify key mountain ranges and which continents these are found on We will also hone our OS map skills by focussing on Mount Snowdon, Children will also learn about how mountains are formed and the affect

Alongside regular e-safety discussions, we will be creating developing their spreadsheet skills and learning how to input formulas to calculate data using Purple Mash.
