

Robert Le Kyng Primary School Home Learning Policy 2021-2022

At Robert Le Kyng Primary School we have done everything in our power to ensure that our school stays open and will continue to do so. However, in the event of either:

- -An individual child testing positive for COVID-19 but remaining symptom free; or
- -The whole school being required to close;

we have prepared a package of remote education that can be implemented immediately. Whilst teaching, tasks and activities will reflect the age levels of specific year groups, we also have aimed to ensure there is a degree of consistency in the remote education we are delivering across the school.

Each Year group from Years 1-6 will provide:

- -Daily, sequenced Maths lessons that include teaching videos and independent worksheets
- -Daily, sequenced English lessons and independent work
- -Daily spelling tasks
- -Daily times tables practice
- -5 topic/foundation subjects delivered each week through a variety of tasks and opportunities
- -The expectation that children read at least 5 times a week to an adult

Monitoring, Assessment and Feedback:

The level of monitoring, assessment and feedback given will be dependent on the following situations:

-In the event of a single child testing positive but remaining symptom free, enough work will be sent home to cover the isolation period. Teachers will monitor, assess and provide feedback on tasks completed via purple mash and will call home at least once a week to check on wellbeing and discuss any barriers to learning.

-In the event of a whole-school closure, the following monitoring, assessment and feedback will be provided:

- The majority of foundation subject tasks and activities will be submitted via Purple Mash. Class teachers will be able to monitor the tasks that have been completed, view submitted work and leave feedback for individual children.
- A class forum where children can post questions or difficulties they
 have with any of the week's learning will be available via Purple
 Mash. The expectation is that teachers will respond to any questions
 within 24 hours. The blog will also be used by teachers to post
 messages/videos identifying and addressing misconceptions as well
 as teaching tips.

Home learning in the Early Years Foundation Stage will be organized similarly to that in Years 1-6, but tasks and activities will be suited to the pupil's age and developmental needs.

All home learning will be available as hard copies that can be collected from the school office.
