English

In English, we will start by learning Poetry. We will be writing our own poems based on the book 'How to Train Your Dragon' by Cressida Cowell. Following poetry, the children will then be learning about instruction writing, where they will write an information piece on how to train a newborn dragon! In this piece, children will be including grammatical features such as subordinating conjunctions, relative clauses and causal conjunctions.

The children will then look at diary writing where they will write a diary entry based in the Anglo Saxon period. Following from this piece of writing, we will then look at Beowulf.

Spellings

This term, children will learn the following spelling rules: words ending 'able', adverbials of time (to help with their writing), adding a suffix to words ending 'fer' and words with silent letters.

PSHE

In PSHE this term, the children will be discussing dreams and goals. They will be investigating jobs and careers to understand how contributions are made by people in different jobs.

Music

In music, children will be singing 'Make you feel my love' by Bob Dylan. They will listen to and appraise different version of this song and get the opportunity to play along with instruments.

P.E.

Children will be practising gymnastics and field hockey this term. This will include dribbling and passing. They may also play some small sided street hockey games.

Science

Science this term will focus on identifying and understanding the properties of different materials and how this determines the particular uses of these materials in everyday life. Children will investigate dissolving to make solutions as well as different methods used to separate a range of mixtures.



History

This term, we are looking at Anglo Saxons! The children will be exploring and describing the main changes of history during this period. They will be ordering significant dates and events on a timeline and describing similarities and differences between people, events and artefacts. Children will then investigate the causes of the changes that happened during this time.

Maths

This term, children will start by learning about properties of number. They will learn about prime, square and cube numbers. They will also learn to find common factors and multiples of numbers.

Later on in the term, children will build on their knowledge of written methods for multiplication and division. Children will learn to multiply by 2-digit numbers and by decimals.

From next term, we will be looking at fractions – it is important that children know all of their tables up to 12x12 in order to be able to work more easily with fractions. Tables should be being practised at home regularly.

Computing

In computing this term, children will be learning to create spreadsheets on Purple Mash. They will learn how to create formulas which can convert measurements and can work out averages for them.

RE

In RE, children will be investigating a number of stories in the Sikh Holy Book, discussing why they are important to Sikhs, and whether they are still relevant today.

French

This term, we will learn about food and how to ask for different food, drinks or meals. As well as this, children will learn to understand a table showing opening hours.
