
Summer Fayre – Saturday 18th June

RLK Feeling safe survey 2021-2022

Last term, we completed our 'Feeling safe' survey with a large sample of children from Year 1 to Year 6.

The questions allow the children to discuss issues and worries and share their thoughts about their experiences of life in our school.

- 100% of the children reported that they feel safe at RLK school ("I have lots of friends" "The Teachers make me feel safe" "Yes-There are a lot of adults here" "I feel safe all the time".)
- 100% of the children said that they had a trusted adult that they could speak to in school
- Most children know what bullying is including cyber-bullying. Those that think that they had been bullied mentioned one off incidents such as "someone was rude to me", "someone was mean to me" and "I was pushed over on the playground". The older children mentioned incidents outside of school such as local parks where they saw older children. (We discussed STOP: Several Times On Purpose and STOP: Start Telling Other People)
- Most children scored the questions 'How well do you think your school deals with bullying?' 9 or 10.
- The children were asked if they had been taught about the following subjects: Mental health & well-being, Physical health & fitness, Healthy Eating, Drugs misuse, Healthy Relationships, Alcohol misuse, Staying safe online and Road safety.
- Nearly all children knew that they had been taught about 'Physical health & fitness', 'Healthy eating', 'Staying safe online' and 'Road safety'. However, some children were unsure if they had been taught about drugs misuse, healthy relationships and alcohol misuse. These areas are covered in an age appropriate way by our PSHE curriculum using the scheme 'Jigsaw PSHE'. But this needs to be more explicit in our teaching. This will be an action moving forward as we move through the year.
