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Swindon Christmas Toy Appeal

The Swindon Christmas Toy Appeal, run by churches across Swindon, is returning for the seventh year in a row. The aim is to bring a little hope and happiness to families who would find giving presents to their children very difficult without resorting to loans. A quarter of children in Swindon, almost 14,000 live in poverty, so it's a great opportunity to bring a smile to children (and their parents) this Christmas.

Many schools, churches, businesses, and organisations got involved last year. Over 4000 new toys, stocking fillers, books and soft toys were donated with presents given to a total of 546 children (217 families).


Between Monday 13th November and Sunday 3rd December this year, churches, businesses, schools, and organisations will again be gathering donations of brand-new toys for children aged 0-17. Families will be nominated to receive presents by agencies in the town, and by participating churches or schools. The referred families will then receive a personalised voucher which they can redeem at churches around Swindon in the two weeks running up to Christmas.

If you would like to like to get involved, please buy a present and take it to one of the <u>donation points</u> by <u>3rd December</u>. Presents can also be made online and then delivered straight to our Bible Society at Stonehill Green, Westlea, Swindon SN5 7DG Alternatively, a financial donation can be made <u>here</u>.

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
