## Enalish

For writing, we will start with an interesting poem of love and sacrifice, 'The Highway Man'. The children will be exploring features such as figurative language, metaphors and personification and will also look at re-enacting parts of the poem in small groups. Additionally, we will be writing a newspaper article with a focus on crime and punishment, using features like reported speech and formal language. Finally, we will practise articulating our opinions and backing them up with facts when debating issues in the modern justice system. In Reading, we will be using the novel 'Holes' by Louis Sachar (a story about a boy unjustly sent to a detention centre). We will focus especially on predicting, summarising, and explaining.

# Spellinas

Children will learn the following spelling rules: words ending '-ant', '-ance', '-ent', '-ence', '-able', '-ible', '-ably', and '-ibly'. Children will also learn to spell some challenging words.

# **PSHE**

Our focus will be 'Celebrating Differences'. We will learn about how important it is to show respect for our own, and different, cultures and understand the importance of happiness and contentment.

## Music

#### Science

We will be learning about how the punishments of crimes have changed over time. Children will use different sources to find out information about types of crimes and how they were dealt with in Anglo Saxon, Tudor, Georgian and Victorian times and will compare and contrast this with the modern justice system.

Art

#### Maths

Children will also be adding and subtracting 4 digit numbers using efficient methods, progressing further by using decimal numbers. Furthermore, we will work on multiplication and division. specifically looking at multiplying and dividing whole numbers and decimals by 10, 100 and 1000.

### Computing

This term, children will be learning about online safety. This will include their responsibilities online, protecting their privacy, how to cite sources and understanding how reliable information is online.

# RE

Children will be investigating the different accounts of the Christmas story by different people in the Bible to address the similarities and differences.
