English

Our story focus for this term is the traditional tale 'The Three Little Pigs'. We will practise retelling and sequencing the story both orally and in writing, as well as innovating a new ending. Then we'll read another book 'The True Story of the Three Little Pigs' which is a twist on the original tale, with children writing a diary entry from the perspective of Alexander Wolf. Following world book day, we will write a letter as the character Goldilocks.

Art

In Art this term the children will be exploring 3D art work. They will look at examples of natural sculptures created by Andrew Goldsworthy and then create their own sculptures using collections of different natural materials. They will then carry out evaluations of each other's work.

Our P.E. this term will focus on developing different ball skills. The children will learn and practise skills and then apply them in simple team games.

Throughout the term Year 1 will continue to investigate materials, building upon our knowledge from term 3. The children will further develop their scientific vocabulary to describe materials using words such as bumpy, smooth, hard, soft, opaque, transparent, waterproof and absorbent. The children will then begin to group and sort materials based on some simple properties.

Maths

This term we will continue to develop our understanding of partitioning, addition and subtraction facts for numbers from 9 to 16. They will explore different ways of representing addition and subtraction using pictures and written number facts.

We will also be looking at how to identify and recognise different 3D shapes, including cubes, cuboids, pyramids and spheres. They will learn how to count the vertices (corners), edges and faces, before comparing how the shapes are similar or different.

Computing

This term we will be continuing to use technology to support our learning across different curriculum areas. We shall be using the 2Go software on Purple Mash to support our directional language in Geography. The children will also be creating and debugging simple algorithms. As part of our work on internet safety we shall be looking at how we can keep ourselves safe when using electronic devices.

Geography

This term we will be looking at our local area and locating local landmarks. Children will learn how to use directional language and compass directions. In addition, they'll learn how to identify features on both a map and an aerial photograph.

Music

The children will be learning about how music can be used to explore identity and culture. They will also develop their understanding of how music and singing can be used to tell stories. The children will create their own music by combining rhythm, pitch and pulse.
