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Road Safety!





Over the past few weeks, Class 1 and 2 have been looking at different modes of transport as well as how to stay safe when out and about. The children have learned how to safely cross at zebra and pelican crossings, which we simulated out on the playground. Children were also the opportunity to learn how to safely cross a real zebra crossing.



Remember to

Stop!

Stop before the curb and stepping out into the road. Ensure wheel of scooters, bikes and pram are not hanging into the road.

Look

Look both ways before crossing. Encourage your children to do the same.

Listen!

Listen to the traffic as well, you may hear an emergency vehicle coming or a car moving quickly. Headphones and ear pods should be removed to safely cross a road.







Remember....

- Children should cross the road with the adult accompanying them to and from school.
 - Young children should be holding hands with their grown up.
 - Children should walk scooters and bikes across the road.
- It is an adults responsibility to model safe crossing of roads. Help us help you keep your child safe in and around the roads.





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On the 19th March, Year 2 were lucky to receive a visit from members of the Dorset & I Wiltshire Fire & Rescue Service. First, we enjoyed an assembly to learn about fire safe-ty and the varied roles of the fire service. We learned an important set of rules if we think there is a fire - Get Out, Stay Out, Call 999. We were also reminded of the importance of fire safety at home; we should have working smoke alarms, have an escape plan from our homes and have an agreed meeting point. We then went outside and were shown the various tools and equipment in a fire engine before having the opportunity to lsit inside!



Our two hockey teams went to the Swindon Hockey Tournament. Both teams did really well with our A team becoming champions for fifth year running. All the children had a great time. Our two netball teams went to the Swindon Netball Tournament. Again, every child had a great day out and we did well progressing to the semi finals.

What is domestic abuse?

Domestic abuse is any type of controlling, bullying, threatening or violent behaviour between people in a relationship. It can seriously harm children and young people and witnessing domestic abuse is child abuse. It's important to remember domestic abuse:

- can happen inside and outside the home
- can happen over the phone, on the internet and on social networking sites
- can happen in any relationship and can continue even after the relationship has ended

both men and women can be abused or abusers.

Types of domestic abuse

Domestic abuse can be emotional, physical, sexual, financial or psychological, such as:

- kicking, hitting, punching or cutting
- rape (including in a relationship)
- controlling someone's finances by withholding money or stopping someone earning
- controlling behaviour, like telling someone where they can go and what they can wear
- not letting someone leave the house
- reading emails, text messages or letters
- threatening to kill someone or harm them
- threatening to harm another family member or pet.

If you, or someone you know, is experiencing domestic abuse and would like some support Paragon Swindon can offer advice as well as practical help. They have a 24 hour helpline on 01793 610610 and can arrange appointments to meet you in a safe space, such as your local doctor's surgery. They can also provide outreach support for children that have witnessed domestic abuse. Free emergency legal protection for all is available in the form of a non-molestation order, these can be applied for at www.ncdv.org.uk and this is something we can refer you to if it is appropriate. 


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Book Fair

If your child would like to learn to cycle or improve their current cycling skills, please use the booking link on the flyer to book your space.













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
