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## Safeguarding against radicalisation: The Prevent Duty

This factsheet is to help you understand what the Prevent duty is, why it is important and how you can help support it.

## What is the Prevent duty?

PREVENT is a government safeguarding strategy to protect vulnerable people from being exploited, being drawn into radicalisation and supporting them with disengaging if radicalisation has already occurred.

## What is radicalisation?

Radicalisation is the process through which a person comes to adopt increasingly extreme political, social or religious ideals. This can in extreme cases, result in condonation or support of terrorism.

### What is extremism?

Extremism is vocal or active opposition to fundamental British values, including democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty and mutual respect and tolerance of different faiths and beliefs.

#### How do we define terrorism?

In the UK, we define terrorism as an action used to further an ideological aim that:

- · Endangers a person's life, other than that of the person committing the action
- Involves serious violence against a person
- · Causes serious damage to property
- Creates a serious risk to the public's health and safety
- Interferes with or seriously disrupts an electronic system

## What might indicate vulnerability to radicalisation?

Feelings of grievance or Going through Being influenced injustice a transitional or controlled by time of life a group Recognising vulnerability to radicalisation Experiencing Desire for status racism or discrimination Struggling with a sense of identity, meaning or belonging

## Why do I need to know this?

To succeed in safeguarding our communities and the most vulnerable people within them, we must work together to be aware of the signs that may indicate radicalisation. If you notice that someone is displaying these signs, there are several ways you can ask for advice or make a referral. If you have a concern it is important that you seek further advice.

## What if I have a concern?

- Speak to the school's designated safeguarding leads, Mrs Smith, Mrs Fisher or Mrs Ward
- Call 101
- Call the local Prevent team on 01380 826454
- If you see or hear something terrorist related call the anti-terrorist hotline on 0800 789 321

Prevent is a supportive space and does not get people into trouble or criminalise them. It provides programmes of support for vulnerable individuals through avenues such as mental health, substance misuse, mentoring and housing services to help build resilience and prevent exploitation by those who seek to draw them into violent extremism or terrorism.

## What if I find harmful information on the internet?

If you come across extremist material such as articles, images or speeches that promote terrorism or encourage violence, content encouraging people to commit acts of terrorism or videos of terrorist attacks you can visit Action Counters Terrorism (ACT) web page to request its removal at: <a href="https://act.campaign.gov.uk/">https://act.campaign.gov.uk/</a>.
